2 CORINTHIANS 2:14-3:18 - PROVE YOURSELF / NOV. 23

SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

Read & Pray

The sermon this week covers **2 Corinthians 2:14–3:18**. To begin our discussion, we will read **3:1–18** together. After reading, spend 60 seconds in silent listening prayer. What applications or thoughts about the text came into your mind? Might those be from the Spirit? Close with a prayer to God for wisdom to apply these truths.

Sermon Recap (to *apply*, not rehash the sermon)

Review the sermon with your group, highlighting the following:

- "The reason imposter syndrome hits so hard is because deep down, we're all running the exact same race: the race to prove we belong."
- "Paul's whole point is this: The Christian life was never meant to run on your own power. Everything God calls you to ... he supplies you for."
- "You might be able to create 'glory' for a little while, but if it was mustered by your own strength, it's a glory that will fade."
- "Transformation doesn't just come from trying harder ... it comes from looking longer. ... What you behold, you eventually become."

Group Discussion

- 1. Where do you feel the pressure to prove yourself right now, and how does that inner voice compare with what this passage says about sufficiency?
- 2. In 2 Corinthians 3, what differences do you see between the old covenant and the new, especially around pressure, power, and where change comes from?
- 3. Paul says our sufficiency is from God, not ourselves. How would your week look different if you believed God makes you sufficient for what he wants you to do?
- 4. Where are you tempted to chase a fading glory (approval, success, image), instead of the permanent glory of the Spirit? How have you seen glories fade before?
- 5. Paul says we are transformed by beholding the Lord's glory. Practically, what helps you fix your gaze on Jesus during the week, not just on Sundays?
